### Helpless to Homefull

A woman and her 11 year-old daughter were recently evicted from their apartment and were homeless. Through Flagler Cares Care Coordination, she received temporary housing, blankets and clothing from Emmanuel's Closet. Career Source helped her gain employment. After she left the shelter, a local church and Flagler Cares worked together to help support them for a few days as she made plans to move out of state. Flagler Cares also supplied gas cards to help the family get to their new home. It was confirmed that they made it safely to their destination.

### Safe Living

A severely mentally ill, elderly woman had extensive trauma history. She was living in a trailer in a high crime area. She had been repeatedly raped over a 6 month period by the same person who broke into her trailer. Through SMA Health's Volusia County Rape Crisis Center program, she was relocate to a safe house out of the county. The next day she confirmed that she finally felt safe.
