A domestic violence survivor was physically and emotionally abused by her partner throughout their 7-year relationship. He was in control of the finances and she wound up homeless with little access to income. Upon entering the program, she was able to gain employment and was promoted. She began working on her credit and in the course of several months, she was able to increase her credit score. Beacon Center/Domestic Abuse Council connected her with a local realtor. She is currently approved for a home loan and is searching for her first home all on her own.

A 4th grade student who was receiving low grades in class has improved her grades since being in this program and was awarded the 'Bring Up Grades' award. She is now helping other younger peers with their homework assignments and activities.

Overcoming Life's Challenges



Post hurricane Ian and Nicole, Katie and her two children moved into the Daytona Beach Residential Campus for families experiencing homelessness in July. Jennifer and her two children moved to the campus in August. These women stayed focused on their goal of lifting their families out of homelessness despite the turmoil caused on the campus by storms Ian and then Nicole. Both increased their household's incomes during their stay. Katie moved her family into permanent housing in January. Jennifer did so in March.

Social Innovation Fund Pitch Competition



Generation Impact conducted its 5th Annual Social Innovation Fund pitch competition Jan. 27, handing out more than \$10,000 in grants. Seven student led projects gave a pitch: Dressed to Impress, Project SAM, Educational Field Day, Reading in the Park, Volusia Giving Gardens, Right to Nutrition and Mainland Book Club Program. Some of the students attended Spruce Creek High School, Mainland High School, Youth Advisory Council of Orange City and Stetson University.

During the competition a Community Foundation of Volusia-Flagler Counties' donor saw Generation Impacts' internal struggle and decided to donate to two groups for \$1,000 each. After the pitch competition, another Community Foundation donor pitched in \$2,500. So, by the end of the event \$14,500 was granted to the seven student led projects.

Generation IMPACT manages the UWVFC Social Innovation Fund, which provides local high school, college, or vocational school students with mini grants in order to implement innovative projects that address critical challenges in Flagler and/or Volusia counties.
