Easterseals Northeast Central Florida	Make the First Five Count*	Make the First Five Count is a comprehensive program designed to increase the potential for young children, newborn to five years old with special needs, to enter kindergarten ready to succeed. The program addresses several areas of needs: 1) improving access to early intervention services, 2) increasing access to Ages and Stages Questionnaire as well as other appropriate screenings and 3) to identify children not meeting their developmental milestones and developing a community-wide shared data base that will track results and increase access to early intervention. 2,690 individuals will be served through this program.	\$100,000
The Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia Counties, Inc.	School Readiness	School Readiness will improve access to affordable quality child care. This includes providing safe and nurturing environments that would otherwise not be available to families identified at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level or whose children are identified "at risk." 11,600 individuals will be served through this program.	\$100,000
Mid Florida Community Services, Inc.	Working Together for School Success	Working Together for School Success addresses the need for children to experience success in kindergarten. This need will be met as a result of the implementation of multiple approaches designed to maximize the child's preschool experience and expand the capacity of the "teacher" in the child's home as well the teachers in the child's preschool setting. The goal of school readiness will further be accomplished as a result of stronger partnerships between teachers and parents. 1,404 individuals will be served through this program.	\$75,000

PACE Academic Services provides individualized academic plans to help fill gaps in academic histories and complete requirements for middle school promotion and high school graduation. Additionally, PACE's trauma informed program model emphasizes a strength based approach to behavior modification. 250 individuals will be served through this program.	\$58,000
Girl Scouts of Gateway Council, Inc.	Girl Scout Leadership Experience*	Girl Scout Leadership Experience seeks to develop the next generation of leaders in Flagler County through Girl Scout Leadership Experience and delivering series programs for girls such as Imagine Your STEM Future and Be a Friend First. Imagine Your Future entails the strengthening of critical thinking and problem solving abilities in the areas of science, technology, engineering and math. Be a Friend First will enable middle school girls to build valuable skills they need to develop healthy relationships, prevent bullying behavior, and become peace-makers in their schools and communities. 725 individuals will be served through this program.	\$10,000

The House Next Door	Education Program	The program focuses on two strategies in order to increase protective factors within the children served, improve behavior, and promote school success.
