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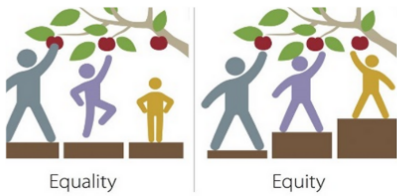

STORIES OF IMPACT



In partnership with another agency, Boys & Girls Clubs created Tower Gardens - a freestanding, hydroponic system. Staff worked with the children to build the units. The children learned how to read instructions, ask for help and work together as a team to solve common problems. The children were excited and engaged. This is what Project Learn is about - making an ordinary activity into a creative learning experience. ⁷



A child with an existing diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder had not accessed therapeutic medical services prior to starting at Easterseals of Northeast Central Florida. When he enrolled into the program he had no communicative or social skills. The therapist quickly determined that he could echo words when displayed by an augmentative communication device.

In six weeks, he showed independent navigation of folders and icons within the tablet and has been independently initiating vocal requests to meet his wants and needs. Being able to communicate one's desires is a huge milestone and behavioral cusp to building social relationships, pre-academic skills and combat maladaptive behaviors, anxiety and depression. ⁸
