EDUCATION



Michael* recently became a single father of three after the mother of his children was incarcerated. Michael's three children, all under the age of two, attended Easterseals of Northeast Central Florida. With support from UWVFC, Easterseals expanded its scholarship criteria to cover families with special circumstances requiring immediate care, such as Michael's. Because of these funds, Michael was able to maintain employment and apply for additional School Readiness funds upon becoming a newly single parent. *Name changed for confidentiality

In August 2017, an Outreach Leader with the Volusia/Flagler County Coalition for the Homeless Coordinated Entry Outreach program, a program funded by UWVFC, began working with a chronically homeless individual with a history of more than 10 years on the street. The Outreach Leader engaged with this individual on an ongoing basis in order to link him to mental health services and motivate him to consider going into permanent housing. By the end of March, the individual was placed into housing at Stewart-Marchman Act's My Place Apartments, a program also funded by UWVFC. The individual is now in safe housing and working to improve his mental health.

FINANCIAL STABILITY







Shannon*, a 20-year-old survivor of human trafficking and severe abuse, was referred to the Healthy Start Coalition of Flagler & Volusia Counties' Family Place after being discharged from the hospital with a positive pregnancy test. Team members at Family Place worked with various agencies to connect Shannon to prenatal care, safe housing, trauma counseling, and a program for survivors of human trafficking. Shannon is now in safe housing, enrolled in school, and communicates more freely with people.
